# Pastor's Message

# You Shall Try....

Author and journalist Jake Halpern's opinion piece in the September 8, 2024, New York Times caught my attention with the title: "My Teenage Son Thinks the World Is Falling Apart. I've Changed How I Talk to Him About It" In the article, Halpern describes Lucian, his15-year-old son, as having a fatalistic streak. Lucian looks at the world as completely falling apart but Halpern has a different point of view. The entire article can be read in the link below. For me it was an interesting article but one paragraph stood out. The words in the paragraph reminded me of what I often hear Christians (and many others) say when we are asked to be part of God's work in repairing the breach in our broken world.

"The real problem with my approach, however, is that I was robbing my kids of a sense of urgency, a sense that the situation, in much of the world, is dire and that it demands their attention. So I've embraced the Iron Curtain\* response: Yes the world is broken, which is why you need to fix it. Lucian's response to this, of course, is: We didn't break it. You did. Touché. He also reminds us: If you can't fix things, what makes you think I can? And I can only reply: Maybe you can't, but you still have to try."

"Maybe you can't, but you still have to try." What do you think of this statement? Is it true? Do we, specifically Christians, have a responsibility to try to make the world a better place even when we know our influence is small and cannot possibly cure all that is wrong in our world?

I think we do and this is why. When Jesus was asked, "What commandment is the greatest?", he answered, "<u>You shall</u> love God. <u>You shall</u> love your neighbor." He didn't answer, "The greatest commandment is..." but instead answered with "<u>You shall love</u>..." In Matthew, Mark, and Luke, the Greek word translated as "You shall love," agapēseis, is a future indicative active verb. This verb is understood as a verb denoting an action which, in the mind of the speaker, will occur in the future. As humans, we can't (don't) love God or love neighbor but "We still have to try." For it is in loving God and loving neighbor that we can repair the breach in our broken world one person at a time. Amen.

Birthdate: April 27. 2005 LCC Sponsorship since November 10, 2010

Kweku is 19 years old and is in Junior High 3 which is equivalent to USA 9<sup>th</sup> grade. Kwekucurrently enjoys learning carpentry skills.

Festus lives in the forested community of Breman Benin, about 63 kilometers northeast of Cape Coast, Ghana, home to approximately 1,600 residents. Typical houses are constructed of cement floors, brick walls and tin roofs. The primary ethnic group is Breman and the most commonly spoken language is Fante.

Our sponsorship of Festus allows the staff of Good Shepherd Child Development Center to provide Festus with Bible teaching, health screenings, malaria prevention education, community service opportunities, school fees, educational materials and handicraft skills training.
