Pastor's Message

Hearts As Wide As the World

(by Henri J.M. Nouwen, Bread for the Journey: A Daybook of Wisdom and Faith)

The awareness of being part of the communion of saints makes our hearts as wide as the world. The love with which we love is not just our love; it is the love of Jesus and his saints living in us. When the Spirit of Jesus lives in our hearts, all who have lived their lives in that Spirit live there too. Our parents, grandparents, and great-grandparents; our teachers and their teachers; our pastors and their pastors, our spiritual guides and theirs – all holy men and women who form that long line of love through history – are part of our hearts, where the Spirit of Jesus chooses to dwell.

The communion of saints is not just a network of connections between people. It is first and foremost the community of our hearts.

I think of something like this often as I reflect on those who have passed away. My parents' love lives within me. My grandparents' love lives within me. All my aunts and uncles and cousins who cared about me in some way or cared about the community or the world – their DNA is part of mine. For my family, at least, that comes from a faith in God – held by my German Lutheran maternal grandparents. Or the faith, mostly unspoken, of my paternal grandparents, who never attended church that I can remember but whose DNA was full of Quaker ancestry with a little Methodist thrown into the mix.

Some of my own DNA also comes Sunday School teachers who showed me God's unconditional love. I never felt like a "poor, miserable sinner" even though I confessed this every week in the Lutheran liturgy. Perhaps in reciting this confession and hearing the words of forgiveness each week, God's grace became part of my DNA long before I understood the meaning of grace.

We all have some DNA from our blood families and others who cared for us. And, as children of God, we have God's grace. May we all live into that grace so that our DNA will be handed down to those that come after us.


Celebrating National STEM Day
