Pastor's Message

New Year's Resolutions - Beginning Again

By the time you read this, Advent and Christmas will be memories. I hope that you have good memories of Christmas 2024 even if they include a few extra pounds. Maybe you even managed to get in a much-needed afternoon nap once in a while. But the New Year is upon us. I'm curious, did any of you make a New Year resolution or two?

I gave up on those several years ago when I realized that while I could keep a resolution going for about a month, life gets in the way and the resolution goes by the wayside. But each January, I keep trying. I keep *beginning again*.

Sometimes I think *beginning again* is the story of God's relationship with God's people all through scripture. Religion Scholar to Speak on Christian Nationalism

The Rev. Dr. David Vásquez-Levy will speak on the topic "Faith-Based Resistance to the Rise of Christian Nationalism" at the January meeting of the Kaua'i Association of the United Church of Christ. The evening will begin at 5:30 p.m. on Tuesday, January 28, 2025, at Kōloa Union Church, located at 3289 Poipu Road in Kōloa.

Christian nationalism, and the ideologies that have fueled it from the very founding of our nation, have left a centuries-long trail of devastation that continues to this day. Through an alliance with White supremacy, it has served as a justification for many of our country's sins: the genocide and dispossession of Native peoples; slavery and racism; the targeting of those who are historically marginalized and the physical and political exclusion of migrants in this country. Because extremist Christian rhetoric is behind much of the leadership, financing, and rhetoric attacking equality and civil rights today, many progressive social movements have despaired over the role of religion in public life. But ceding the power of religious narratives to extremists can have serious consequences. Join us for a conversation on the need to reclaim the religious narrative from this kind of extremism.

Dr. Vásquez-Levy is the President of Pacific School of Religion (PSR) in Berkeley, California, a progressive Christian seminary, graduate school, and center for social justice that prepares spiritually rooted leaders to create a world where all can thrive. A committed pastor, a nationally recognized higher education and immigration leader, and a sought-after speaker, Vásquez-Levy leads at the intersection of faith, higher education, and social change.

Dr. Vásquez-Levy's talk will be followed by a time for questions and answers, as well as a brief presentation of upcoming courses in Theological Education in Leadership offered in Hawa'ii by PSR.

A reception of hors d'oeuvres and drinks will follow the presentation.
